- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 3 lbs. confectioner's sugar

1 lb. chocolate, melted (for dipping) Thoroughly mix potato, coconut, salt and vanilla. Gradually add sugar and mix until thoroughly blended. Shape into eggs on cookie sheet and let ripen overnight. Next day, dip into melted chocolate. Set eggs onto waxed paper to harden. Decorate with tubed icing if desired.
