PEANUT BUTTER PIE



9" chocolate Graham cracker crust 1 cream cheese (8 oz. package)

- 1 cup peanut butter (creamy smooth) 3/4 cup sugar OR 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 tablespoon margarine
- 1 tub Cool Whip (8 oz.)

(Optional garnish - Cool Whip, grated chocolate) Beat softened cream cheese and peanut butter, add sugar, vanilla & margarine. Beat until well mixed. Fold in 1 1/2 to 2 cups of Cool Whip. Place mixture into pie crust. Refrigerate (or freeze to serve at another time).
