


Friday night, members furnished a variety of soups, crackers and desserts. Sampling everything was fun and oh so tasty.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH By Betty Werner EGG DROP SOUP



1 1/2 quarts chicken broth or clear soup stock

- tablespoons cornstarch mixed in
- 1/4 cup of cold water
- eggs, slightly beaten with a fork
- scallions, chopped, including green

Bring soup stock to a boil. Slowly pour in the cornstarch mixture while stirring the stock, until the stock thickens. Reduce heat so stock just simmers. Pour in the eggs slowly while stirring the soup. As soon as the last bit of egg is in, shut off heat at once. Serve with the chopped scallions on top. Ready in 30 minutes.

HAVEYOU ACTUALLY SEEN THIS BRIDGE?


