
with the bright lodge, so appropriately decorated for November, to gather in for games and exchanging stories.

# ZUCCHINI CARROT MUFFINS

- (18.5 oz.) pkg. carrott cake mix egg
- 1/2 cup applesauce
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 1/2 cups shredded zucchini
- 1/2 cup raisins

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1/2 cup chopped pecans

In mixing bowl, combine the cake mix, egg, applesauce and oil and mix well. Stir in the zucchini, raisins and pecans. Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups three-fourths full. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until muffins test done. Can serve with cream cheese.

### DID YOU KNOW. . .

....you can make easy deviled eggs by putting the egg yolks in a zip lock bag. Seal, mash until they are all broken up. Add remaining ingredients, reseal, keep mashing to mix thoroughly. Cut the tip of the bag and squeeze mixture into egg. Throw bag away - easy clean up.

....you can make scrambled eggs or omlets really rich by adding a couple of spoonfuls of sour cream, cream cheese or heavy cream into the eggs and beat to mix well.
