Even though it was February in the North Georgia Mountains, the weather was beautiful and everyone enjoyed visiting. There were 27 folks in attendance which was really good for the weather we have been having around the state. We certainly hope to see everyone at the March Meeting in Cleveland. Do you have a Compass in your Motor Home?

Many of us have a device on our dash that is a compass and outside temperature display. When the key is on or we hold down one of the buttons for 3-4 seconds, we can tell what direction we are pointed and what the temperature outside is. Does yours have trouble providing the proper direction? If so, it might be due to poor connections on the wiring or interference from other electrical items close to it. On most Winnebago Motor Homes, the compass head is hidden in a false compartment above the driver. In our case, it is behind a false wall in the side compartment above the driver. Check to make sure the wires are connected securely and that the head has not fallen loose and is dangling. When I checked ours, whoever had put it in had broken the plastic fasteners on the edges of the head and it was barely hanging there. When I tried to unplug the wires to check the connection it fell down. It is now double sided taped to the floor of that cabinet instead of hanging from the top of the cabinet. It ended up that my problem was the small fan I had put in the overhead compartment that holds our Dish DVR above the driver. The front compartments get warm in the summer so I was using the fan to circulate the air and keep the DVR cooler. This fan was putting off a magnetic field that was blocking the compass head from being able to set its directional signals. So, if you are having trouble with your compass, check the wire connections and then check to see if you might have placed a fan or a new speaker too close to the directional head of the compass.

Keep all our members in your prayers as we go forward in the New Year. Especially those like Marianna Moosa, Gladys Cain, Melva Dalton and Betty Werner who have been ill or have had surgery. Every member of our club is needed and missed when they are not present.
